Adaline Miller Royce, 92, of Newnan, Georgia, passed away peacefully after a long battle with dementia on September 26, 2024, at Wesley Woods of Newnan. She is preceded in death by her beloved husband of 70 years, Richard (Dick) Royce, who died in May.

Adaline was born on December 22, 1931, in Savannah, Georgia, the daughter of John Gordon Miller, Jr. and Edith Graham Miller. She grew up on Tybee Island and attended The Pape School (now Savannah Country Day). She made her debut in Savannah and attended Agnes Scott College, receiving her B.A. in English in 1953.

Adaline was a longtime member of Athens First United Methodist Church, where she spent many active years on the Altar Guild, UMW, and visiting elderly members in nursing home facilities and those aging at home.
