



## Ernest Sizemore

September 11, 1928 - September 19, 2022

Ernest Sizemore died peacefully on September 19, 2022, at the West Georgia Hospice in LaGrange, Georgia, at the age of 94. Ernest is survived by his wife of 67 years, Helen Ward Sizemore, his son, Dale Sizemore and his wife, Nancy Miller Sizemore, all of Moreland, and his daughter, Lynn Sizemore Jones and her husband, Mark Jones, of Cumming. Ernest was born in Hazard, Kentucky on September 11, 1928, to parents, Herma Sizemore and Arthur Combs, and grew up in Lothair, Kentucky. Ernest graduated from Hazard High School; and afterwards, joined the Air Force. He served for three years during the Korean War. He was in Korea for six months and achieved the rank of Staff Sergeant. Ernest met the love of his life, Helen, in Dayton, Ohio while working as a Civil Service employee at Dayton Air Force Depot. After the birth of their two children, he was transferred to Robins Air Force Base in Warner Robins, Georgia. He moved his family to Perry, Georgia where he and Helen raised their children. Ernest and Helen were known for their jitterbug dancing skills and won several contests, enjoyed camping with their children and friends and hosted many shrimp and fish fries at their Tucker Road home in Perry.

He retired from Civil Service at age 55 and enjoyed many years of playing his favorite game, golf, and supporting his children whenever they asked for his help with the grandchildren, projects and moves. He was a member of the Moreland United Methodist Church and cooked for the Wednesday Night Fellowship for many years. Ernest always had dogs and took them on daily walks on Polk Road. He enjoyed working on crossword and Sudoku puzzles and playing cards.

Called Ernie by friends, he is remembered as a good man who was willing to help anyone with anything. He loved the outdoors and especially gardening and planting trees, bushes, and flowers. During trips to Kentucky, he would bring back his favorite plants. Ernest also loved fishing and he and his family spent many nights fishing for crappie at Lake Sinclair and he built a small pond next to their Moreland home that continues to thrive. He loved cooking and trying new recipes that he found in magazines and the newspaper. Helen and Ernie enjoyed traveling, and after retirement, they took trips to Europe, Central America and Australia with a group of friends.

Ernest was a wonderful father, grandfather, and great-grandfather and all will miss his smile, warm embraces, sense of humor and fun.
