Lawson Eugene (Gene) Chesnut of Moreland, GA passed away on December 12, 2013. He is survived by his wife of 64 years, Patsy Billingsley Chesnut. He was born April 5, 1930 in the Chesnut family home in Moreland, GA to the late Lawson Todd and Fannie Mae Hughie Chesnut. In addition to his parents, he is preceded in death by his brother J. T. Chesnut and his sisters Eleanor Meadows, Janie Thompson, Nancy Kirby, and Frances Swygert. He has one surviving sister, Electa Summers.
