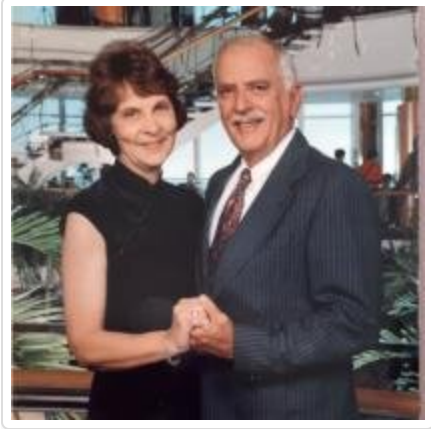




Marjorie Louise Thacker
