



## Mary Ann Mildred Weiner

March 18, 1934 - March 25, 2024

Mary Ann Mildred Steinmeyer (married name Weiner) was born to Walter Steinmeyer and Esther Steinmeyer on March 18, 1934.

A proud member of Normandy High School's class of 1951, Mary Ann moved to New York City shortly after graduation to experience big city life. Mary Ann later relocated to Seal Beach, California, where she dedicated her life to raising her daughter Sandra and son Jon. She would later return to school, earning her Master's Degree in Industrial Psychology. Mary Ann specialized in the design and validation of tests that were used extensively in the aerospace industry. She had a long and successful career in that industry, including a stint at the NASA Space Center in Clearlake, Texas. Mary Ann would later expand her role, serving as a member of Rockwell International's complex litigation team. A longtime member of the Episcopal Church, Mary Ann was blessed with a strong and abiding faith in God (her favorite prayer was God Be in My Head). She also had a wide array of interests.

She was an accomplished tennis player and lifetime fan, fiercely loyal to Roger Federer and highly suspicious of Rafael Nadal. She was politically active, involved with the National Organization of Women (NOW), and worked the phones for Hilary Clinton in 2008. Mary Ann was an avid genealogist who traced our family tree back to the 1400's and traveled all over Europe gathering the information that allowed her to do so.

Mary Ann also traveled the world with her flight attendant daughter Sandra, who took every opportunity to help her mom explore destinations stretching all over the world. Mary Ann's son Jon had the good fortune to have his mom come live with him the final six months of her life, an experience for which he is eternally and deeply grateful.

Mary Ann is survived by her daughter Sandra Steinmeyer; son Jon Weiner (and daughter-in-law Carla Cary); grandchildren Justin Timpone (and his wife Kelly), Brett Scheiner (and his wife Mary), and Sarah Scheiner; and great grandchildren Liam Timpone, Xander Timpone, and Ethan Scheiner. We all love our Mimi deeply, miss her desperately, and look forward to the day we will all meet again.
