Raymond Rudolph Bruening, 90, passed away May 6, 2010 at Lafayette Nursing and Rehab center in Fayetteville, GA. Raymond was born June 29, 1919 in Milwaukee, WI to Rudolph and Alma Bruening. Through his thirty-one year working career with J.C. Penney Company he served in Wisconsin, Florida and Georgia. In each place he served, he was affectionately known as the Candy Man as he was always passing out peppermints, never meeting a stranger.
