Thomas Richard Thompson, Jr., who was known to all as simply “Tommy” died July 10, 2009 at Golden Living Center in Thomaston. Tommy was a native of Coweta County where he was born August 18, 1944; the son of the late Thomas Richard Thompson Sr. and Lucille Malcolm Thompson. Tommy’s life was one that was dedicated to service – first to his country. He served two tours of duty in Viet Nam. After his service in the Army, he entered civilian service in law enforcement. He had a total of 35 years continuous service. For the last 19 years, before his retirement, he was a Lieutenant in the Coweta County Sheriff’s office warrant division. After his career in law enforcement, Tommy found great solace in the time he was able to spend camping and relaxing on the Chattahoochee River in Heard County. For him it was a little bit of heaven. Tommy is survived by his wife Bonnie B. Thompson of Senoia; his children, Bradley Thompson and his wife Vickie and their children Kourteney and Jonathan, Justin Thompson and his wife Angie and their son Austin, Jody

Thompson and his wife Amanda and their family, Ronnie Thompson and his wife Anita and their family of Carrollton and Barron Reagan of Atlanta.
